

Example:

Eleanor D., age 82, contributes \$20,000 in cash and receives a lifetime annuity of \$1,700, of which \$1,249.50 is tax-free for approximately the first eight years. As the annuitant, she receives an income tax deduction of \$9,631.60, resulting in tax savings when she claims it. At Eleanor's passing, the gift annuity remainder goes to The Masonic Charity Foundation of Connecticut.

When Carrie came back to Chris with a proposal to fund a Virtual Dementia Tour (VDT) Program through Second Wind, Inc., it struck a chord. "My mom said once, 'I wish you could get in my head and understand what I can't understand', and I was like okay, virtual reality is the way to do that."

The Masonic Charity Foundation is partnering with Second Wind Dreams to provide a comprehensive Virtual Dementia Tour to the Masonicare community. They use evidence-based scientific methods to create a virtual experience that builds empathy and awareness for individuals caring for people with dementia, and are training Masonicare employees to become certified VDT trainers.
